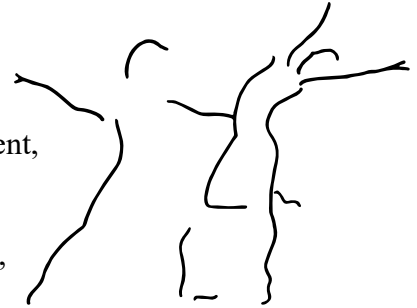


Our Teaching Philosophy
